A. Course objective

1. Conveying general knowledge on international migration with an emphasis on the state, regional and global levels of possible analysis. 2. Presentation of the theoretical framework covering the issues such as: migration dynamics and the role of the state, migration policy, immigration versus emigration, integration of immigrants. 3. Analysis of selected EU member states in terms of their current immigration situation, immigrant and foreign population, and exercised immigration policies. 4. Developing the students' ability to analyze the immigration policy and to evaluate its effectiveness and efficiency based on specific examples. 5. Increasing the students' awareness of the fact that formulating a targeted and consistent immigration policy is crucial to face the current and future migration challenges. 6. Awakening students' observation skills and sensitivity to the problems of international migrations, their multidimensional causes and consequences for contemporary societies sending and receiving migrants. 6. B. Course syllabus

Topics 1-5 offer an introduction to the general knowledge on international migration and its theoretical framework. Topics 6-13 encompass the issues such as immigration, immigrant and foreign population, and immigration policy based on the example of selected EU member states. Topics 14-15 tackle these issues from the EU perspective and compare the common migration policy with EU member states' policies to identify the extent of their Europeanization.

Is able to notice connections between immigration policies of different EU member states and the immigration policy at the EU level.

Can discuss possible consequences of immigration policies in different EU countries with reference to their internal situation.
