

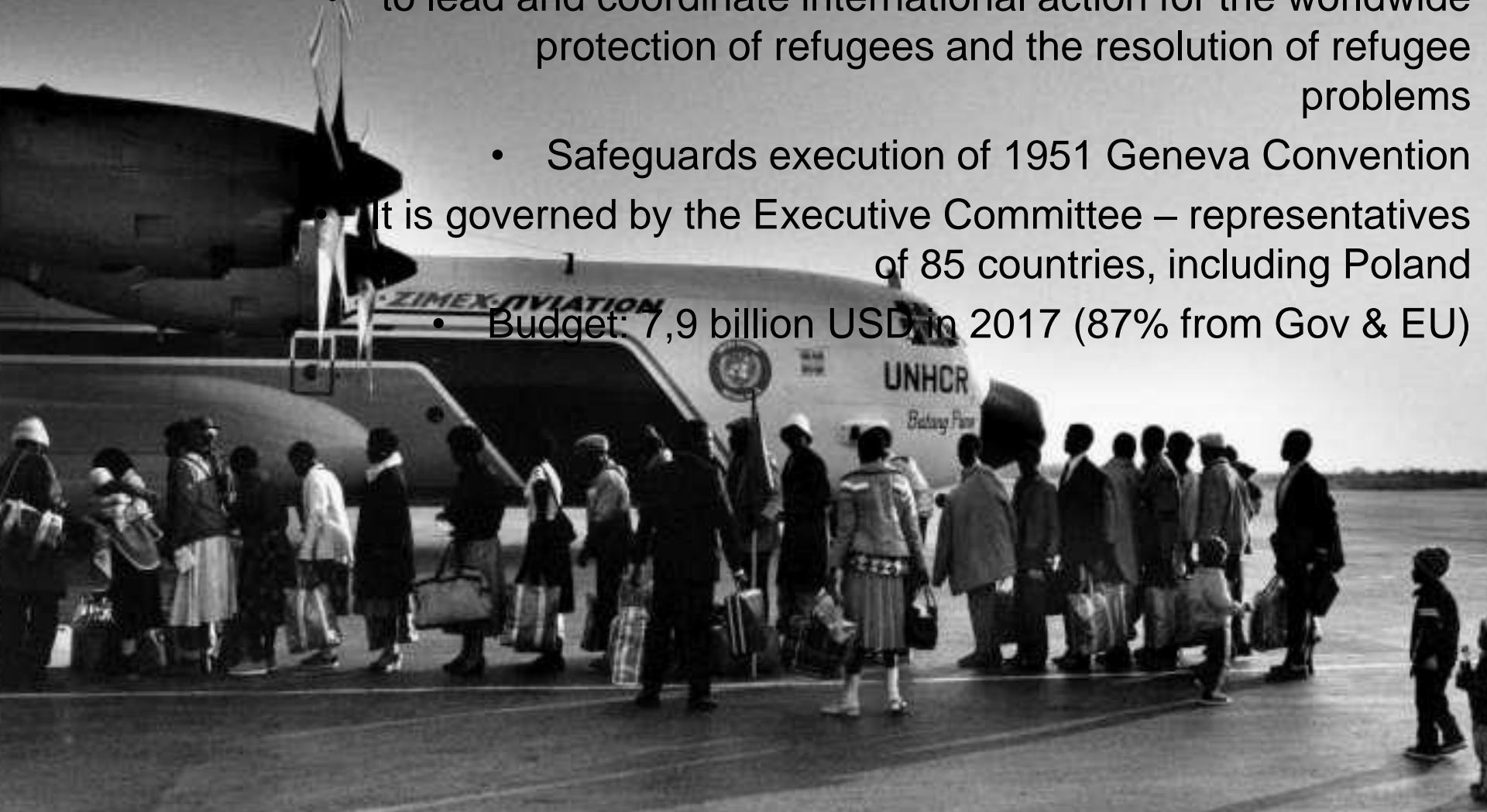


UNHCR and its mandate

MARIA PAMULA, UNHCR Poland

1 refugee without hope
is too many.

- Created in 1950 by UN General Assembly
- to lead and coordinate international action for the worldwide protection of refugees and the resolution of refugee problems
- Safeguards execution of 1951 Geneva Convention
- It is governed by the Executive Committee – representatives of 85 countries, including Poland
- Budget: 7,9 billion USD in 2017 (87% from Gov & EU)

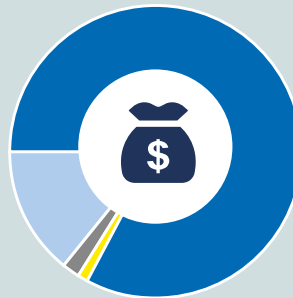

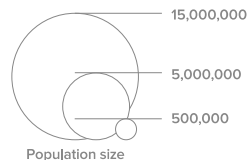

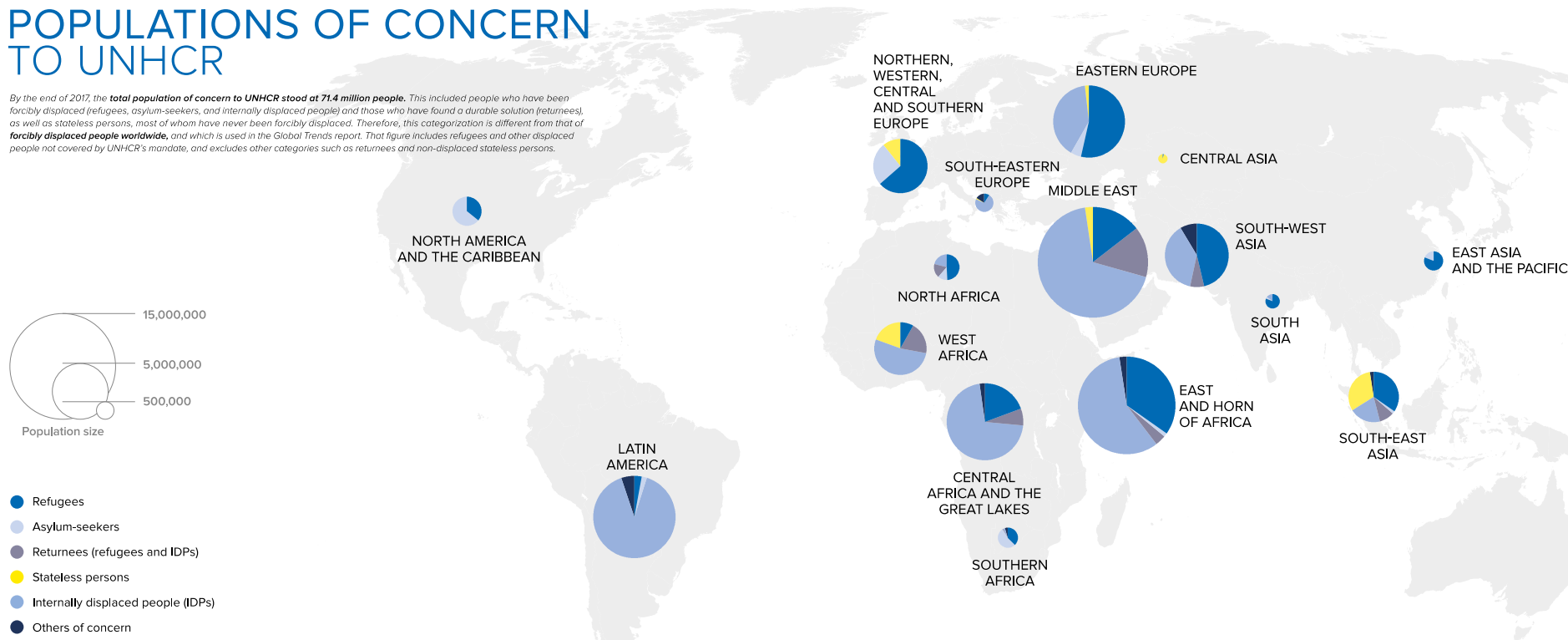

POPULATIONS OF CONCERN TO UNHCR

By the end of 2017, the **total population of concern to UNHCR stood at 71.4 million people**. This included people who have been forcibly displaced (refugees, asylum-seekers, and internally displaced people) and those who have found a durable solution (returnees), as well as stateless persons, most of whom have never been forcibly displaced. Therefore, this categorization is different from that of **forcibly displaced people worldwide**, and which is used in the Global Trends report. That figure includes refugees and other displaced people not covered by UNHCR's mandate, and excludes other categories such as returnees and non-displaced stateless persons.

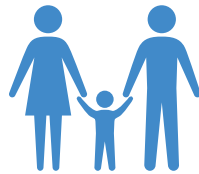

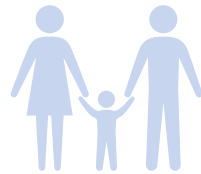
TOP 10 COUNTRIES OF ORIGIN | 2017



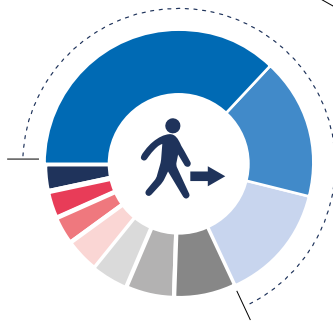

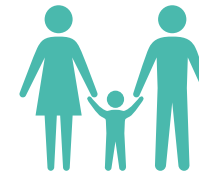

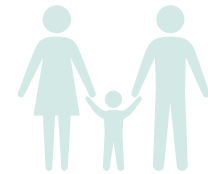
TOP 10 COUNTRIES OF ASYLUM | 2017



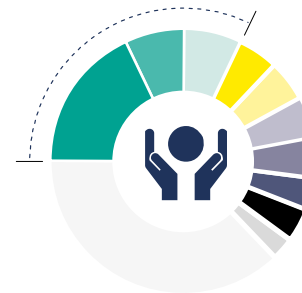

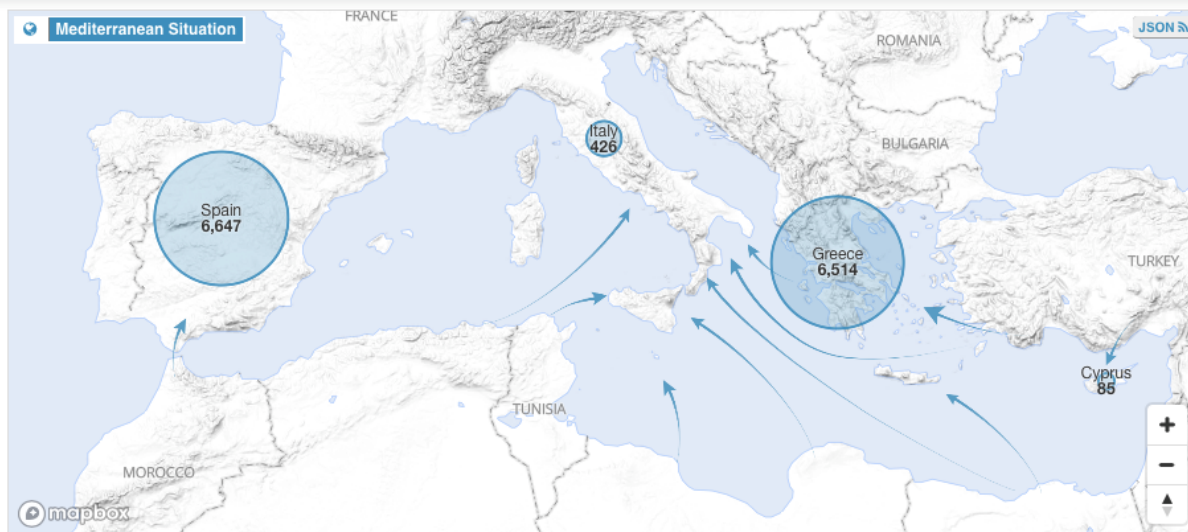
